SU REP

NSS BOYCOTT MOTION

Lorna: The NSS is the National Student Survey. There a lot of Students Unions boycotting the NSS, as many did last year. There are many reasons for this. A key one being that it can be used to increase tuition fees (through the Teaching Excellence Framework). This turns students into statistics with questions that are sometimes too specific and sometimes not specific enough. Obviously I am disabled and disability rep. One big issue for me is that it reduces the representation of minority groups. For these people, their full views are usually more complicated than the questions allow, for instance if lecturers make discriminatory comments.

Lorna: So the question is, as a JCR, should we boycott the NSS?

Darcy: To clarify, this wouldn't force people to take it or not, right?

Lorna: Oh by the way, the group that runs the NSS starts calling people around this time. A lot of finalists will have had this. They call people in the middle of the night and things and we don't think this is fair.
