FORMAL RULES MOTION

GM: It was lovely to have the first formal of the first year with the majority of you guys there. We really hope you enjoyed it and it can be quite a strange experience the first time but formals can be a really nice event with your friends. This motion is just about the rules for future meetings, no phones during the formal, no standing during the formal, and things like that. I propose that these are the rules for the year.

DH: This is something that is put in the first JCR meeting every year, MCR (Middle common room with postgrads), SCR (Senior common room – grads chosen to be in the SCR), this is for the joint formal agreement.

MT: I just want to point out that my job is to enforce these rules that you guys have agreed to. I don't stand up and walk around for the power, but because my role means I must make sure you guys are following the rules you agreed to. So, if there is anything you want to add or amend, do share.

TH: Any questions of clarity or substance?

Q: Why have formals rules?

A: Formals are a big part of durham experience, it is not a be all and end all, in place to ensure that they run smoothly. Is there an amendment you would like to propose you are more than welcome to. There are many amendments that we can make, there are somethings we can't change like meal times as these are set in stone because catering team work overtime. So if you were allowed to leave, you would have to eat quicker for certain courses.

SPORTS PERFORMANCE SCHEME MOTION

TH: We have now got a presentation by Paul, [President of squash society]

PS: In the principle, I am of the view that we have problem. Let me illustrate. We have a problem that Collingwood and other hill colleges which are larger than us which make them better than us at sports. So we need focus. Our sports societies should be spending their money in a more focused way. We could put this money into specific things, to become performance society.

We have lots of fantastic societies. Access to performance coaching would benefit teams, they can provide techniques and drills. This won't be weekly, could be a termly thing. This way won't be more expensive.

Having performance society would allow for better recruitment at the freshers fair. Whilst we have DU teams, and sports society but I want a middle ground. I want them to have access to better equipment. I think it is very important to have sponsorship opportunities, I think this will encourage companies to sponsor us. This is something long term and will need time. If we pass this motion, this is something that will benefit our sports societies long term.

We have to make sure that the right societies become the performance societies, need to make sure they are going to benefit the most, most popular and the most energetic. So we need a panel to determine this. So we are going to have the elected JCR committee, Vice Presidents, Sports Representative, Assistant Treasurer, the President to form the panel to decide.

Currently there is 350-pound limit, this motion will play over time and how we can improve societies.

TH: Any questions of clarity or substance?

Q: You mention about popularity. What do you mean? What about societies who have strict number they can allow? Cheer, for example, can only accept a certain number for the team. A: By popularity, we mean impact. So cheer has a good reputation. Another thing is impact which we will be looking at, if you don't get it this time, there is also next year.

Q: How many societies can you accept at the moment?

A: Can't give a specific number at the moment, it is dependent on interest and finances and what the panel think.

Q: What about new sports societies which are so small?

A: When taking into account new societies, we need to ensure that . That is why we need to have people who represent everyone to make sure that the best decision for the college. We aren't a big society hence why this

Q: Have you considered expanding it performing arts, music and arts? Could we make this an amendments? Has this been thought of?

A: Definitely, yes. In the future, I want this to support everyone. Sports is the starting point because we have a lot of catching up to do. Music and arts can improve and certainly something we can expand to, but we need to start somewhere

Q: This is a lot of performance level. Will this still be a society for people to enjoy and try a new sport?

A: Yes, enjoyment is a crucial part. New people can bring engagement. Even if they haven't tried this sport, they will be able to

Q: On sponsors, what would recommend is a good barrier?

A: We are going to remain independent. We can give away things such as sponsors being able to display themselves on a banner. These can be companies that we approve of. There is a clause under JCR under college under university, which includes what is and isn't allowed in terms of sponsorship

Q: What if you don't want to join the scheme?

A: Societies can decide to join the scheme. If you society has decided to join the scheme, then that's great.

Q: Once they are part of the scheme, does it mean they will forever by part of the scheme? A: Well the society is going to approved for that one year and then reconsidered the next year. If a society becomes part of a scheme then we need to make sure they meet the requirements. Democratically, the society decides as a whole whether they wish to be part of the scheme.

Q: Surely this would make the college sports societies more of a competitive atmosphere, similar to DU sports? Formal sessions are different to training sessions. I don't think it will encourage people to come and have fun, it makes it too competitive defeating the purpose of college sports? A: This is going to play out over time. This is going to create the first basis, the scheme accommodates. If it becomes too competitive, this scheme accommodates. If you go to a society then you can have fun whilst being performance focussed. Over long period of time it can get the rewards it deserves. If no one is having fun then this motion has failed

Just a comment from finance perspective, we will be not allocating more money because of the scheme. This scheme means you can apply for more than £350 but it is up to Fincomm to decide and they can reject.

Q: I think the bigger problem is the term performance society. This sounds quite scary, as a first year. It would be quite useful for big societies like football, if you want to be performance team you can join that one but there are lots of other teams to join. But cheer for example, if you just want to try it out and have fun, you can't because cheer has only has one team. Also, is it too much commitment to run a performance team?

A: Very good point, because of that we are using the performance scheme but this is within college. For uni boards and all that, we are still using current names. You can do what the majority of your society think is best.

Q: Do you think its fair that sports can get more that £350 but others don't? A: Yes, I see your point but yes this is just the start. With this excitement and egagemnet, sponsorships will allow more money to be put in.

Q: I am just wondering how you plan from alleviating the stress from the exec between balance of fun and stress of performance? I am also concerned about the retention of numbers attending trainings?

A: I agree exec has a lot of pressure, this will help us stand out. We don't' want to be known as the small college but the one that looks out for its students. The exec are passionate and energetic to share their passion and delegate and have people to help them.

Q: Amendment suggestion, get rid of the £350.

A: Rejected as this is necessary for the basis for future opportunities. As this is a financial motion, finn comm has been approved. If you would like, feel free to write an amendment for future meetings, but as it stands, finn comm are happy with it.
